- label jars clearly e.g. plum chutney
- say on the label if there is a short shelf life e.g. eat within 3 days
- if it contains nuts, put this on the label
- if you can, please deliver jars to Una, who is running the Jam Stall. She's at 28 Pine Grove. This is so that jars can be priced in advance. She is around on Thursday evening, but it's probably best to phone her in

advance 8241 8160/07748 792441. If this time is not convenient for you, then you could deliver them to me at 13 Lancaster Garden (☎ 020 8946 3750). Or else just bring them along on Saturday morning.

And finally, the International Ukelele Orchestra will be playing from around 12 noon. If you are a musician or singer of any type of music appropriate to this sort of occasion, why not come along and perform either before or during their break. We have an entertainments licence, so we may as well make use of it!
